Our Met Office Weather Station has been running for over three years and we continue to earn a Gold Award each year for our regular input of readings to the national database. It takes a few minutes a day [always at 0900hrs GMT (so 1000hrs at the moment!)] to record the weather from the previous 24 hours (temperatures, rainfall, sunshine, state of ground, cloud cover) and, when back at home/boat, transfer those reading to the Met Office. All very straightforward and easy. We would welcome another two or three

on the team. Our rota is online and very flexible - you can go on holiday do different days - opt in and opt out the more of us there are the easier it is to swap and change about. Then they came here and, standing on the Boardwalk on a sunny day, looking out over the water and the boats, suddenly Mandy had a 'Eureka' moment and thought 'YES this is perfect. I can live here.' Everything fell into place quite quickly and now she can't imagine living anywhere else!

A background in administration, accounts and running a business, gave Mandy a great job in Derby but with a working day spent largely on her own, she wanted more people around during the day. They do say be careful what you wish for as the Marina Office is very much the other end of the spectrum! But she's enjoying it enormously and looking forward to getting to know everyone.

Investing to Move Forward

Whilst the last few months have meant most things slowing down or stopping, the Marina has been using the time to prepare for a series of projects and installations which will be of particular benefit to the boaters and lodge owners.

Non-slip pontoon coverings

With 'lockdown' restrictions easing, work has now started on installing the Dura Composite non-slip pontoon covering and there are positive reports from the superberth pontoons where it's already in place. Of course it'll really prove its value when the winter weather sets in by when it's expected the installation will have been completed.

Fibre Broadband

The second major installation is the fibre broadband. The BT Openreach line is now ready; the next element is for w3z to fit the connecting fibre line around the Marina which runs to a box at the end of each jetty. A final (removable) cable will connect that box to a device or a router in each boat. At the moment, the superberths have 'jetty boxes' which are connected back to the current w3z WiFi and those who are trialling this 'hybrid' system see a big difference in stability and speed consequent upon having a wired connection back to the main WiFi mast. The one complaint that has been noted is from moorers who say they're now staying up into the wee small hours because it's so good being able to

watch Netflix movies without any buffering or line dropping! The full installation timetable is being finalised and things should start







happening shortly. There will be a residual WiFi system for those who want a basic internet connection and there are those who may prefer to stay with their current external provider (Vodaphone, EE, 3 etc.).

For those choosing the fibre broadband, data will be uncapped and the choice will be based on speed with the cost comparable to that paid for a fibre broadband contract to a house. Full details will be circulated and questions about equipment and connections answered; for now, just wait a bit!

Smart-card washers and dryers

Complementing, and additional to these major site-wide installations, the replacement and additional smart-card washers and dryers are going in the laundry blocks shortly.

Storage Sheds

A new section of storage sheds will be going in near the Lakeside Lodges road entrance. These will be available to anyone for rental, so if you are interested, get your name down early in case there is a high demand.

Trim Trail/Kids' Play Area

Finally there is the Trim Trail/ Kids' Play Area. This is intended as a low-key, low-impact development at the top of the junction of the two fields in the North-West corner of the Marina – the 'dog walking' field with the weather station and the Park. It will use natural materials for the Play Area – e.g. wooden stepping stones, climbing piles or crawl throughs – and be intended for younger children. The trim trail is intended to encourage stretching and low im-

pact cardio activity for those wanting specific exercises as part – perhaps – of a regular walking habit or a keep fit regime.

Cars, Vans and other Motor Vehicles



Parking for moorers continues to be under pressure and this despite a significant increase in parking provision, particularly over the last few years. A number of the spaces are occupied by unused, untaxed and/or uninsured vehicles and those vehicles without an MoT. This is in direct contravention of the Mooring Contract which states parking (subject to availability) is only for `validly taxed motor vehicles'.

In addition, there are too many vehicles which do not display the Marina's green ID sticker with the boat name.

A crackdown in under way and all vehicles falling into these categories will be indentified, their owners contacted and if no action is taken in a very short time, the vehicle will be removed. Be warned!
