t's probably a bit early to second guess the winter weather that may come our way but remember 2010? The morning of the 10 December? So very cold with the Marina then frozen for many weeks.

With Covid restrictions possible easing a bit in the next few weeks, it might be an opportune moment for those who aren't liveaboards to get down to the Marina and winterise their boat and for those who do liveaboard, a bit of checking and maintaining is always worth it! The list on the right is for a <u>complete</u> close down and you can cherry pick, depending on how long you'll be leaving your boat between each visit and whether you will be leaving heaters on board.

The very very best way to keep your boat healthy if you will be leaving it for weeks at a time might well be through a helpful liveaboard neighbour who can keep an eye out for you (you could do as others



and leave keys and your phone number). Do also make sure the Office has your up -to-date contact information.

# Your Winter Checklist

Check engine coolant, if not obvious then drain and replace anti-freeze mix.

□Grease exposed linkages

Grease battery main terminals, isolate engine battery

□Grease stern gland

Batteries: let your landline do its work

Ensure the bilge pump will work automatically or visit the boat to check the bilge water level

□A light application of WD40 to vulnerable electrics (and main control panel if it is outside)

□Grease all door hinges

□Remove all perishable food and rat treats

□Remove plants

Leave cupboards open for flow of air

Leave fridge door open (if you're switching the electricity off) or pop a couple of tea-bags in

□Remove as much textile as possible or store it hanging in free air

□Make sure ventilators are unobstructed and

leave a couple of windows open a crack

□Put boat poles, lines and any roof equipment inside that will suffer being left out

□Turn off gas

□Turn off main electric (excluding automatic bilge pump)

□Try and keep the diesel as full as possible to prevent water condensation in the tank

□Install a couple of tube heaters or an oil-filled radiator on thermostatic switches

And if you're draining down:

Drain down hot water heaters and leave drain plugs out

Drain down central heating (or calorifier); check indirect heating water anti-freeze

□Ideally close main water tank stopcock, pump out remaining water, turn pump off

Leave taps open, turn off water pump

☐Make sure the shower drain pump is run immediately before you leave

If you are on the Marina, or visiting, through the winter months, please be careful on the pontoons. There is the new anti-slip layer on the pontoons but the jetties may still be slippery so walk with caution and use the sand provided in the large containers.

There is one water tap with a heat trace on each pontoon, so water should still get to all boats. And do remember to make sure you have laid in a good amount of lekky on your meter. 2020

## Superfast Fibre Broadband

Superfast fibre broadband is now being installed marina wide. As superfast fibre broadband becomes available to your pontoon or lodge, you can sign up to the service you need.

#### Fibre Broadband Benefits Overview

Data is unlimited - no more running out when you need it the most.

Choose your speed - 10, 20 or 50mbps download speed (1, 5, and 50mbps upload respectively).

Routers and LAN cables set up package is £70.80 (inc. VAT) for a dual band router and 10 metre LAN cable. or source your own (FWA routers can be reconfigured to work). A 'How To' guide to setting up is being produced. It is easy.

Try before you byte! Boaters can take up a 1 month trial period (Streaming Tariff) during the first 2 weeks following the wiring of your pontoon. Set up package cost is refundable if router and cable returned within 2 weeks undamaged.
