The Butcher, The Baker, The Ice Cream Maker will be a major and attractive central

feature of the new Boardwalk. The Barton Marina store is hugely popular with locals, visitors and boaters and it will be the same in the new Mercia store. The BBICM (for short!) was born out of a shared love of food and farming by Steven



and Tracey McKendrick and their family from Rangemore who have more than 40 years farming experience.

Most of their meats come from within the



National Forest and surrounding areas, using native breeds such as Aberdeen Angus and Hereford

wherever possible. Like the cattle, the lambs are reared on an extensive system and enjoy their life in some of the most beautiful countryside in the Midlands. The pork is truly free range and the resulting bacon is home cured and smoked. In the Barton kitchen they hand-bake their own range of meat pies, pork pies, pasties, sausage rolls and turnovers. The butchers present a dazzling array of meats alongside home produced sausages, burgers, bacon and cooked meats.

There is locally baked artisan bread from a long-established local family firm, Hindleys, and if you like to bake your own, try the range of flours from Wessex Mill. Most people love a real home-made cake and Garden Farm Cakes are exactly that. Made by Tracey. At home.

They will stock fresh fruit and vegetables, locally grown where possible and choosing what is best and freshest on the day. The range of sauces, condiments and chutneys come from a host of small producers. Last but not least, there is the excellent Red Lion Farm Ice Cream made by Alison Hollinshead on the farm outside Stafford

using the milk from her herd of Jersey cows.



Steven sees coming to Mercia as a natural progression for the business. The Barton kitchen area can then be used to its full extent since it will be supplying both Farm

Shops and all the produce - butchery, baking, cheese and delicatessen goods. vegetables and ice cream -



will be available. There will be a butcher on site to prepare and cut meat, with specialist or large orders coming from Barton.

A new enterprise for Steven and Tracey will be the Coffee Shop. They will be using the produce from the Farm Shop and they're looking forward to starting what they see as a natural follow on from everything else they do.

BBICM will be needing staff for the coffee shop and Farm Shop and would be very happy to recruit locally. So, around about April, notices will appear about job opportunities.

Mercia Marina is well known to Steven. Having worked nearby and with a friend whose boat is moored here, he has watched its growth with real interest. Its

location and its status among marinas, together with the number of things going on at the site all make for a place



with a lot to offer, he says. People come to it as a destination. He and Tracey are very much looking forward to September and the start of their new venture.

Residential Berths at Mercia

It is now looking very likely that there will be 180 residential berths at the marina in the near future. Discussions between the Marina and the Council and Valuation Office are continuing, so information is being updated as appropriate.



The first moorers' meeting on this issue was held on the 9th of January and dates

for each area of the Marina are now in the diary - 2 in February and 3 in March. The first Residential Berths' Bulletin has been issued by Robert and there are Notes from the first meeting. Ask the Office for copies of these - hard copy or email - and make sure you've signed up for 'your' area meeting if this is a matter that concerns you. Above all, if you think you are at all likely to want one of the residential berths then get your name on the list now. There is a waiting list for Mercia moorers who aren't one of the first 180, but your name needs to be on it. The Marina is only accepting provisional new 'external' applications all of whom will have to wait until all those already moored here have made their wishes known and berths allocated. At this stage, you are not committing yourself, just registering your interest. When all the facts are known (including cost and the conditions which may apply) you will be asked to make a final decision and sign up formally. And for any questions and concerns, and for signing up for meetings, go to the Office. Or talk to your Rep who will be up to date with the latest news.

outs recently . The "fixers" report this is happening because boaters are not careful enough about what goes into their boats' toilet storage tank. There just mustn't be sanitary articles,



nappies, wet wipes, kitchen towels and quilted toilet paper. Do your visitors or guests know the drill? Macerator toilet owners know how they fail to deal with these things ... it's the same for the pump out machinery. So please take more care!
