Modern Dog Training



Would you like to understand your dog and its behaviour better? Know how to change 'bad' habits? Make your boat a safe and secure home? Make sure your pet is getting the best diet and that you're avoiding things around the Marina which may not be good for his or her health? Perhaps learn how to do a nose to tail health check? And all this together with the basic control commands taught through reward-based fun training that could lead onto games and agility training?

Jim and Kim brought their boat to Mercia last October and, loving the new lifestyle, they took the big decision that Jim would give up his corporate work world and devote his time to what he really loves training dogs and their owners. He's been involved with dogs for most of his life and



takes them seriously. He says the approach to dog training has changed significantly and it's now done by humane principles, professionalism and motivational leadership. He has a Diploma in Canine Psychology, is a full member of The Institute of Modern Dog Trainers, has completed numerous practical and educational courses with professional accredited organisations such as the Academy of Dog Training and Behaviour and continues to broaden his knowledge by attending courses and seminars relating to his work. He is currently studying for a further Diploma as a Canine Behaviour Practitioner. He is fully insured, CRB checked and Dog First Aid trained.

He will begin Mercia dog training classes in June so act fast if you're interested! He will

be able to do two or three classes a weekend (8 dogs per class maximum to allow for individual attention as



required) and once the dogs' skill levels have been assessed, classes would be of groups with similar abilities, safeguarding against people and dogs being left behind with their learning, subsequently giving both more confidence. These classes are for Mercia Marina dogs only - those from outside have their classes held elsewhere. The Marina classes will be held on the grassy area in the far corner. www.progressdogtrainingschool.co.uk The Marina is very much behind this new initiative believing it will benefit individual dog owners and the whole community. It will be subsidising the cost of the first set of classes for each dog. And Jim has all the equipment you'll need.

Want to take the next step? If so, give Jim a ring or send him a text (07721 555764) so you, your dog/s and he can meet up. You can tell him what you feel you would want to achieve and what you feel would benefit your dog. He can check on your dog's age, vaccinations, previous training experience and so on. Then, if you wish, you can fill out a simple enrolment form.

Finally, a big welcome to Jim and Kim and their five dogs (Paige, Fern, Jess, Bart and Ruby) as newish members of the Mercia community. It'll be great to see dogs playing noughts and crosses, having team games and delighting their owners with a host of new tricks and abilities!

The Marina and the Internet

A number of people on the Marina have problems with their internet connection.

Some use the Marina's WiFi, others use one of the mobile networks. If



you are less than happy with your internet speed or reception, there are a number of things to know and things to try. If you're still not satisfied, then you could call or text me (Jo James) and I'll put Wynne onto it to see if he can work his magic! A couple of basic things

1. Just as your TV needs to pick up a signal, so does your laptop/phone/tablet. If you are sitting on a chair surrounded by a steel boat, that's not going to be easy. Try in the cratch or in the open air. If that gives you

better speed, then you might consider an antenna which would bring the signal into the boat and rebroadcast it wirelessly. 2. If the signal is no better when you're in the open air, it may be to do with where you're moored, who you're using as your internet provider (although this is mattering less as most providers are using the EE network), or which of the Marina WiFi masts you use. For the Marina WiFi, work out which mast has the strongest signal and connect to that one. If you need help, then ask.

3. Advances in technologies are constantly increasing the sensitivity of mobile phones, laptops and tablets. Your problem may lie with the age of your bit of kit and it may be worth thinking about a replacement. 4. Maybe your laptop is actually fine but needs a bit of a clean up? You could have a lot of clutter which is just making a smooth operation difficult.

Getting things working well is often a case of trial and error. Wynne is a senior tecky in an international IT company. There's not much he doesn't know about hardware or software. He's happy to give moorers and lodgers his help and advice, so do feel free to ask!
