rapidly become a familiar part of the Mercia Marina skyline. The Boardwalk businesses, including- the bar/bistro and the farm shop (the Butcher, Baker and Icecream Maker) are now starting their individual fit outs and, all being well, will be opening to their first customers in mid-September.

New planning permission will allow up to six 'business' boats the end of the visitor moorings, and the hope is that some will be permanently based at Mercia and the rest will be coming for different times throughout the year - adding colour and variety to complement the busy Boardwalk.

Stuart and Sven are continuing their work creating the Sensory Garden with its water feature, rocks, walkways, soft planting and colour. It'll be a year or so before David Boddy's design and their hard work begin to show the results but it will be worth waiting for! There will be a small Piazza at the heart of the Garden which will be used for events at various times.

The Marina's Festival Weekend - 11 and 12 October - will be the occasion for a more formal celebration of the Boardwalk, and one which will welcome all moorers and lodge owners, their friends and families, friends of the Marina and members of the local communities. Put the dates in your diary now!

#### European Health Qigong Games July 2014, Mons, Belgium

John Collinson, our own T'ai Chi practitioner, has just returned from a very successful First

European Health Qigong Games. With 16 teams competing and teams of up to eight, competitors ranged from a 12year old boy to peo



year old boy to people in their 70s. John was part of a Derby team of 5 people led by Carol Gascogne from the Derby T'ai Chi Centre. In



the individual competition, Derby collected a total of 3 gold, 6 silver and 3 bronze medals be-

tween them - with John winning a gold and a silver. In the team competition, Derby won a gold and two silver. So John won two gold and three silver medals! A wonderful result. Well

done John and the team. Qigong is not dissimilar to T'ai Chi but uses its forms and routines as a system of wellness.

John's travels out from the Marina were not just to Belgium. In April he spent three weeks in China - partly as a tourist and partly in training

with a group from a national T'ai Chi School. Spending four days in Beijing, they moved on to Xi'an and then to the Wu dang Mountain. John intended - but failed - to send back a Mercia on Tour picture ! Handing over his day rucksack for the Forbidden City Security Guards to check, when he subsequently reached inside for the T-shirt to ready himself for his notable pose, he discovered it was no longer there!

#### **The Tillerettes**

There are a number of women at Mercia who say they would welcome the chance to gain more experience at the tiller - in particular going through a lock, winding, mooring and reversing. Others would like a 'refresher' course and a further group would like to start virtually from scratch. So we have a plan!

"The Tillerettes" will pair any of the above with one of a select group of experienced women drivers on the Marina (well, three women and two honoraries!) to spend a

bit of time doing one, two or all of three bespoke sessions - i) to Stenson, through the lock, wind and return; ii) to Willington, wind, moor, set off again and return;



iii) round the Marina, reversing, going into and out of a jetty mooring. The sessions will last anything from one to three hours depending on what is wanted and this and dates - can be discussed and agreed between the pairs of Tillerettes.
