Following that meeting, the pairing up has started and there have been a couple of excursions organised! The next meeting entitled "Know Know Know Your Boat" took place on Tuesday 25th of November. Sue Winning recounts her trip to Shobnall with Maisie Trotman:

We came to boating later in life than most, but it had been a dream for 5yrs. Both of us did a Helmsnans Course in 2011, prior to having our first holiday. This has proved useful as we now know more than we thought we did after listening to other boaters.

When I saw the Tillerettes advertised I jumped at the chance to put my name down as a refresher.

We bought our boat Breakaway (50' cruiser stern) from New and Used 16mths ago, and the furthest we have been in her is Fradley Junction so far. As I have only just retired we

hope to continually cruise a little further afield and will be leaving the marina at the end of November. My hubby Charlie doesn't mind me steering, but so far I only steer when nothing else is around. I get a bit panicky when confronted with obstacles and traffic. I have never taken her into a lock, and never taken her out of her berth in the Marina. Maisie Trotman contacted me and offered her experience on a trip to Shobnall. The weather was forecast dry for the day (needless to say it rained most of the journey).

Under Maisie's guidance I reversed out of the berth (in wind) and managed to get her out on the cut without bashing her. We then set off on our cruise. My hubby was assigned to dog sitting (Chip, Maisie's Jack Russell), and making tea and coffee, which he did admirably. He stayed in the saloon all the time and was very well behaved. Maisie's first question to me was "does your husband worry about you bashing the sides of the boat". Well he has done it few times himself, so he can't really comolain.

It was a pleasant cruise. At one point we had a weaving, speeding Henry V coming towards us (it was a wonder the moored boats kept on their moorings). At Shobnall again under Maisie's guidance I took Breakaway into the lock and even managed to pick up my tea making crew. I was very



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proud of myself.

We stopped for lunch and after a short break travelled back again. We even saw 3 kingfishers on our return journey.

We just got back before dark. All was going well in my effort to get her back on her berth, when we had a slight mishap. My hubby suddenly disappeared off the end of the finger jetty. As he had alighted to help moor he slipped (very slippery from the rain), and luckily after I put the engine in neutral quickly he pushed the boat away from his leg and so averted being squashed. Only 1 leg got wet luckily, and apart from bruises no harm done. Needless to say he scrubbed the finger jetty the next day. I hope to do some manoeuvring practice soon, then I feel I just have to get more practice instead of letting my hubby do it all the time. What would I do if he couldn't do it?

I am very grateful to Maisie for her time and patience, and I think both hubby and myself learned a lot from her.
